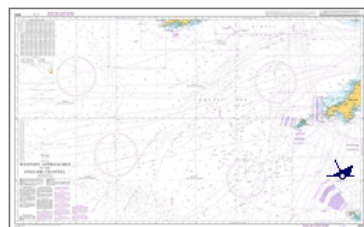

## History

[Letzens Jan](#) 25/08/2010

Echunga, built by Sir Raylton Dixon & Co., Ltd., Middlesbrough in 1907 and owned at the time of her loss by Anglo-Saxon Petroleum Co., Ltd, was a British tanker of 6285 tons.

On September 5th, 1917, Echunga, en route from Port Arthur with a cargo of fuel oil, was sunk by the German submarine U-52 (Hans Walther), 40 miles NxE of Ushant. 9 persons were lost.

Echunga SS was a 6,285grt defensively-armed Australian Merchant ship, requisitioned by the Admiralty.

On the 5th September 1917 when on route from Port Arthur, Texas for England she was torpedoed by German submarine U-52 and sunk when 40 miles N by E from Ushant. 9 lives lost. Owner Adelaide S.S. Co, Adelaide.
