Manvantara MV was a Dutch Motor Tanker of 8,237 tons built in 1931 by Nederlandsche Scheepsbouw Mij. N. V., Amsterdam for the Royal Dutch Shell. On the 13th February 1942 she was sunk in an air raid by a Japanese planes in the Java Sea between Palembang and Batavia.
