History

Allen Tony 05/03/2008

Bulysses MV was a British Motor Tanker of 7,519 tons built in 1927. On the 11th September 1941 when on route from New York - Svdnew (30,0 Aum) - Stanlow in Convoy SC-42 and carrying a cargo of 9,300 tons of gas oil she was torpedoed by German submarine U-82 and sunk S of Cape Farewell. One crew member from the Bulysses (Master Bartram Lamb) was lost. The master, 53 crew members and six gunners were picked up by the Finnish merchant Wisla and landed at Liverpool.
