## <u>Lettens Jan</u> 12/12/2009

On 9th April, Japanese Operation C continues. The Japanese carrier striking force (Vice Admiral Nagumo Chuichi) raids Trincomalee, Ceylon, which has been cleared of shipping in expectation of the attack.

Despite the precautions taken by the British, Japanese carrier bombers attack the ships they find returning to Trincomalee. British carrier HMS <u>Hermes</u> is sunk, as is Australian destroyer HMAS <u>Vampire</u>, Britisi corvette HMS <u>Hollyhock</u>, depot ship HMS <u>Athelstane</u> and RFA oiler <u>British Serqeant</u>.

The Shipping Controller (Uk), London The position of Controller-General of Merchant Shipbuilding was created for Lord Pirrie at a time when merchant shipbuilding in the United when merchant shipbuilding in the United Kingdom was in a very unsatisfactory state and a stimulus to increased production was urgently needed. He went to the Admiralty without any staff, and, as a war measure, a large number of standard cargo steamers were built in British yards under his authority and with his active management. The standard ships, for which the management. The standard ships, for which the original programme had been laid down by the Shipping Controller, were built for account of the State and have since been sold to the shipping industry. Lord Pirrie on his appointment gave close attention to the speedy repairing of torpedoed ships and improved the organization.
