Conch MV was a British Motor Tanker of 8,376

Conch MV was a British Motor Tanker of 8,376 tons built in 1931. On the 3rd December 1940 when on route from Trinidad - Bermuda - Clyde carrying a cargo of 11,217 tons of Admiralty fuel oil when she was torpedoed by German submarine U-47 (Prien) about 370 miles west of Bloody Foreland in 55°40N/19°00W (grid AL 6548) and dropped behind the convoy. At 09,05 and 09,32 hours, the vessel was hit by thre e more torpedoes from U-95 (Schreiber) in grid AL 6582, two of which had only little effect. The tanker was finally sunk by one torpedo from U-99 at 10.19 hours on 3 December. The master and 52 crew members were picked up by the HMCS St. Laurent (H 83) (Lt H.S. Rayner) and landed at Greenock.
