Darina MV was a British Motor Tanker of 8,113 Darina MV was a British Motor Tanker of 8,113 tons built in 1939 by Blythswood Shipbuilding Company, Scotstoun, Yard No 55 for the Anglo-Saxon Oil Company. She was powered by a oil, 502nhp giving 12.5 knots. On the 20th May 1942 she was torpedoed by a German submarine whilst sailing from Stanlow to Texas City after she had dispersed from Convoy ON-93. Five of her crew and a gunner were killed, her captain, Capt Cuthill survived.
