San Casimiro MV was a British Motor Tanker of Sall Cashillion MV Was a Bittish Motor Tailier of 8.046 tons built in 1936 by Blythswood Shipbuilding Company, Scotstoun for the Eagle Oil Company. On the 20th March 1941 she was captured by German Battle Cruiser GNEISENAU on the 15th March 1941 off Cape Race, and scuttled on the 20th March 1941 off the Azores. She was finally sunk by gunfire from
