San Florentino SS was a British Steam Tanker built in 1919 and of 12,842 tons. On the 2nd Septemner 1941 when on route from Glasgow for CURACAO in ballast she was torpedoed and sunk by gunfire from U-94, 22 crew lost from a total of 56.
