
### Allen Tony 04/05/2009

The British tanker San Gerardo SS, Capt. S. Foley, was some 700 miles off Cape Hatteras, North Carolina, on March 31st, 1942, when she was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine U-71. Capt. Foley and 50 others were lost. The tanker was not in convoy.
