

San Wilfrido SS was a British Steam Tanker of 6,458 tons built in 1914 by Armstrong, Whitworth, England for Eagle Oil Transpoprt Co. Ltd., London.

On the 3rd August 1914 she hit a mine off Cuxhaven and sank . Crew taken prisoners.
