## History

Lettens Jan 03/04/2010

On September 28th, 1944, U.S. submarine <u>Bonefish</u> (SS-223) sinks the Japanese merchant tanker <u>Anjo Maru</u> in the South China Sea, 13°10′N, 120°08′E.

Anjo Maru was a Japanese Tanker of 2,086 tons. On the 2nd March 1942 when she was the Dutch Tanker ANGELINA she was scuttled to avoid capture off Soerabaja. She was salvaged by IJN and renamed Anjo Maru. On the 28th September 1944 she was sunk by torpedo from the American submarine USS <u>Bonefish</u> in the Southern Chinese Sea.
