Lettens Jan 24/08/2012 On October 24th, 1944, U.S. submarine USS $\underline{\text{Snook}}$ (SS-279 Lt.Cdr. G.H. Browne) torpedoes and sinks the army cargo ships Arisan Maru and Sinsei Maru No.1.

Arisan Maru, takes 1777 souls, mainly American prisoners h her, causing the greatest maritime disaster ever for the US.
