At 04.13 hours on 25 Mar, 1942, the unescorted Ocana was hit by one torpedo from U-552 and burst into flames immediately. The U-boat left the tanker in a sinking condition, U-boat left the tanker in a sinking condition, but she did not sink and burned out. The only survivors, three engineers and a British gunner were picked up by the USS Mayo (DD 422) the same day. The floating week of the Ocana was spotted three days later by the HMS Fleur d e Lys (K 122), which was escorting the tanker Dolabella and was scuttled by gunfire by the HMCS Burlington (J 250) on 15 April in 43° 24N/64°45W.

Ocana MV was a Dutch Motor Tanker of 6,256 tons built in 1938 - Wilton - Fyenoord NV, Netherlands. On the 25th March 1942 when on route from Curacao to Halifax carrying a cargo of 8,500 tons of clean oil she was torpedoed by U-552 and sunk. 53 crew lost from a total complement of 57. ref. used:www.ubootwaffe.net
